<b>Why?</b>	Financial companies choose how they share your personal information. Federal law gives consumers the right to limit some but not all sharing. Federal law also requires us to tell you how we collect, share, and protect your personal information. Please read this notice carefully to understand what we do.

<b>What?</b>	<p>The types of personal information we collect and share depend on the product or service you have with us. This information can include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ <b>Social Security number</b> and <b>Account Balances</b></li> <li>▪ <b>Transaction History</b> and <b>Purchase History</b></li> <li>▪ <b>Account Transactions</b> and <b>Load History</b></li> </ul> <p>When you are <i>no longer</i> our customer, we continue to share your information as described in this notice.</p>

<b>How?</b>	All financial companies need to share customer’s personal information to run their everyday business. In the section below, we list the reasons financial companies can share their customer’s personal information; the reasons <b>First National Bank</b> chooses to share; and whether you can limit this sharing.

Reasons we can share your personal information	Does First National Bank share?	Can you limit this sharing?
<b>For our everyday business purposes</b> – such as to process your transactions, maintain your account(s), respond to court orders and legal investigations, or report to credit bureaus	Yes	No
<b>For our marketing purposes</b> – to offer our products and services to you	Yes	No
<b>For joint marketing with other financial companies</b>	Yes	No
<b>For our affiliates’ everyday business purposes</b> – Information about your transactions and experiences	No	We don’t share
<b>For our affiliates’ everyday business purposes</b> – Information about your creditworthiness	No	We don’t share

What we do	
How does First National Bank protect my personal information?	<p>To protect your personal information from unauthorized access and use, we use security measures that comply with federal law. These measures include computer safeguards and secured files and buildings.</p> <p><b>We also limit access to your personal information to only those employees who need the information to perform their job functions.</b></p>
How does First National Bank collect my personal information?	<p>We collect your personal information, for example, when you</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ <b>Open an account</b> or <b>Pay your bills</b></li> <li>▪ <b>Use your prepaid card</b> or <b>Give us your contact information</b></li> <li>▪ <b>Make deposits or withdrawals from your account</b></li> </ul> <p><b>We also collect your personal information from others, such as credit bureaus, affiliates, or other companies.</b></p>
Why can't I limit all sharing?	<p>Federal law gives you the right to limit only</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Sharing for affiliates' everyday business purposes – information about your creditworthiness.</li> <li>▪ Affiliates from using your information to market to you</li> <li>▪ Sharing for nonaffiliates to market to you</li> </ul> <p>State laws and individual companies may give you additional rights to limit sharing.</p>
Definitions	
Affiliates	<p>Companies related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ <b><i>First National Bank does not share with our affiliates.</i></b></li> </ul>
Nonaffiliates	<p>Companies not related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ <b><i>First National Bank does not share with nonaffiliates.</i></b></li> </ul>
Joint Marketing	<p>A formal agreement between nonaffiliated companies that together market financial products or services to you.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ <b><i>Our joint marketing partner(s) include nonaffiliated financial companies that we may partner with to jointly market financial products or services to you.</i></b></li> </ul>
